



## **Fair Housing Advertising Words and Phrases List**

There are words and phrases that are entirely acceptable and some that are entirely unacceptable. Sometimes it will depend on how they are used. The general rule is to avoid references to any of the protected categories, or discouraging applicants who have physical or mental limitations. In addition to the federal protected categories, there also may be state and local protected categories that may apply to your property. These are our recommendations for best practices.
